We can go through the motions of serving God, but if our hearts are not in it; then, we're missing the point. The more we are aware of and experience God's love in our own lives, the more prone we are to respond in love by serving Him and the church.

HER S OF FAITH

Faith shows the reality of what we hope for; it is the evidence of things we cannot see. Through their faith, the people in days of old earned a good reputation. -Hebrews 11:1-2 (NLT)

After the old patriarchs, we have the apostles and the other disciples, the early church fathers, and the faithful men and women of God through-out every generations are filling that list.
